



Girlguiding LaSER Champions Role Description

Would you like to take an active role in supporting Girlguiding London and South East England through delivering your own campaigns and projects as well as promoting local and regional events?

We are looking for driven, enthusiastic young women to help us promote and help organise events for Girlguiding LaSER. If you'd like to shout out about Girlguiding and make sure that members your age can make the most out of everything it has to offer, becoming a Girlguiding LaSER Champion could be for you!

The Champions sit under the Chair of Champions, who will be your first point of contact if you have any questions or issues.

THE ROLE - What will I do?

- Take an active role in the organisation and attend at least two events per year promoting Girlguiding and our ethos.
- Bring forward ideas and manage them independently
- Communicate regularly with the Chair of Champions about interesting campaigns or events that you would like to be involved in or that you would like the Champions to address as a collective.
- Stay up to date with events and campaigns coming up in Girlguiding at a local, regional and national level.
- Once a year attend a planning meeting for the year's possible events. During this meeting, with the Chair of Champions, you will agree who will be responsible for attending which events.
- Evaluate any attended events.

Expectations

This role should normally take up no more than one or two hours of your time per week and is for a minimum term of two years. The role will take up slightly more of your time only in certain circumstances, for example when planning or attending an event. There may be special projects or events that require more input.

Communication with the Champions team is important. Every three months we would like to hold an online meeting for all Champions (dependent on availability) to discuss what is going well, ideas for improvement and any upcoming projects for the following three months. This will be led by the Chair of Champions, and each champion will have the chance to discuss their interests, thoughts and ideas. We'll arrange dates for these meetings as far in advance as possible.







The Chair of Champions is there to support you, so you get the help you require. In our initial meeting, we can discuss if anyone would like additional training before undertaking their role.

If you know that you won't be able participate in an event - if you are due to be on holiday, or are unwell, for example - make sure you notify the Chair of Champions so that we can make alternative arrangements for any absence.

- Aged 16 26, member of Girlguiding LaSER.
- Ability to bring forward and share ideas.
- Willing to manage projects from idea through to execution.
- Ability to work in small teams (remotely and in person).
- Excellent communication skills.
- An open and approachable manner.
- Reliable and trustworthy.
- Creative and enthusiastic.
- A commitment to ongoing personal development.
- Desire to motivate and inspire girls and young women from a broad range of backgrounds.
- Interested in helping your community and passionate about making a difference
- Ability to motivate and inspire adult volunteers.
- Good organisational skills.
